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### **Simultaneously (adverb)** اسی وقت میں ایک ساتھ

at the same time.

**Example:** "the telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks"

**Synonyms:** at the same time, at one and the same time, at the same instant/moment, at once, concurrently, concomitantly

**Antonyms:** singly

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### **Wrangle (verb)** جھگڑنا، جھگڑنا، جھگڑنا

have a long, complicated dispute or argument.

**Example:** "the bureaucrats continue wrangling over the fine print"

**Synonyms:** argue, quarrel, row, have a row, bicker, squabble, have words, debate

**Antonyms:** agree

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### **Aggravate (verb)** بڑھانا، بڑھانا، بڑھانا، بڑھانا، بڑھانا

make (a problem, injury, or offence) worse or more serious.

**Example:** "military action would only aggravate the situation"

**Synonyms:** annoy, irritate, exasperate, anger, irk, vex, put out, nettle, provoke, incense

**Antonyms:** calm, conciliate

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**Unruly (adjective)** بے قابو بے رحم بے رحم بے رحم بے رحم

disorderly and disruptive and not amenable to discipline or control.

**Example:** "a group of unruly children"

**Synonyms:** disorderly, rowdy, wild, unmanageable, uncontrollable, disobedient, disruptive

**Antonyms:** disciplined, obedient

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**Rhetoric (noun)** بول چال بول چال بول چال

the art of effective or persuasive speaking or writing, especially the exploitation of figures of speech and other compositional techniques.

**Example:** "he is using a common figure of rhetoric, hyperbole"

**Synonyms:** oratory, eloquence, power of speech, command of language, expression, way with words, delivery

**Antonyms:**

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**Ransack (verb)** بے رحم بے رحم بے رحم

go through (a place) stealing things and causing damage.

**Example:** "burglars ransacked her home"

**Synonyms:** plunder, pillage, steal from, raid, rob, loot, rifle, sack, strip, denude

**Antonyms:** ignore, neglect

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**Persecute (verb)** بے رحم بے رحم بے رحم

subject (someone) to hostility and ill-treatment, especially because of their race or political or religious beliefs.

**Example:** "his followers were persecuted by the authorities"

**Synonyms:** oppress, abuse, victimize, ill-treat, mistreat, maltreat, discriminate against

**Antonyms:** encourage, inspire, abet, support

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**Insistence (noun)** اصرار اصرار اصرار

the fact or quality of insisting that something is the case or should be done.

**Example:** "Alison's insistence on doing the washing-up straight after the meal"

**Synonyms:** demand, bidding, command, dictate, instruction, requirement, request, entreaty, urging

**Antonyms:** challenge, dispute, question

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**Convalescent (adjective)** صحت یابی صحت یابی صحت یابی

(of a person) recovering from an illness or medical treatment.

**Example:** "a convalescent child"

**Synonyms:** recuperating, recovering, getting better, on the road to recovery, improving, making progress

**Antonyms:** faltering, regressing, weak, worsening

overwhelm (someone) with things or people to be dealt with.

**Example:** "we've been inundated with complaints from listeners"

**Synonyms:** overwhelm, overpower, overburden, overrun, overload, swamp, bog down, besiege, snow under

**Antonyms:** drain, reclaim, dry, desiccate, parch

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
